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## Richmond County communities thrive when ...



... people can meet their basic needs

- Rent is unaffordable for 51% of renters
- 10% of people don't have health insurance
- There is one mental health provider for every 430 residents



... good jobs are accessible to everyone

- There are 13 candidates for every job opening\*
- The number of people working increased by 4% from Feb. 2020 (pre-COVID) to Dec. 2023
- The number of people working decreased by 12% from Dec. 2007 (pre-Great Recession) to Dec. 2023



... the economy works for everyone

- 46% of residents are considered low-income (less than \$59,900 for a family of four)\*\*
- The richest 5% of households make an average of 26 times more than the poorest 20% of households

\* Candidates include all people willing to work in the county, regardless of county of residence

\*\* A family of four is considered low-income if they make below 200% of the poverty level, or \$59,900 in 2022, the most recent year with available income data.
