Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs) are owned by people who have historically been excluded from accessing private capital and public contracts because of who they are — Black, Indigenous, people of color, women, people with disabilities, and people who are socially and economically disadvantaged.



WHY PUBLIC POLICY MATTERS



Private loan applications from businesses owned by people of color are denied at **twice the rate** of business loans from white-dominant businesses, despite creating jobs with good pay and growing at a faster rate.
